On trash days you must put your trash curbside. The maintenance staff will not pick up

trash that is in your yard near your home. If the staff has to go back to your home to pick up trash that you did not put curbside on their first pass of your home then



you will be charged a \$50.00 maintenance fee that will be added to your rent statement.

Trash Pickup Days are Tuesday and Friday.

1st day of each month
and is late after the 5th
of the month.



✓ On the 6th of the month a late charge of \$45.00 is assessed <u>PLUS</u> \$6.00 per day until the rent is paid!



Any time a resident has a complaint about an issue, they need to come to the office and put it in writing on a Resident Complaint form. If it

is not in writing then we will not address the issue.

Also, we will not take complaints over the phone. All complaints MUST be in writing. We need to have the name, address and lot number of the person(s) about whom you are complaining. If you don't have this information then there is not much need to come in and fill out a form. If you have pictures to put with the complaint form, that is even better.

Your name will never be given to the person or persons about whom you are complaining. All that will be revealed is that we have received a formal complaint at the office concerning whatever the matter happens to be.

We will have normal business hours on Saturday May 26.

Please slow down!




There are signs in the community that the speed limit is 5 MPH!


Memorial Day is a federal holiday for remembering the people who died while serving in the country's armed forces. The holiday is observed on the last
